We selected our topic because we were both interested in women breaking barriers. We also had background knowledge on Anne Frank and the subject of the Holocaust. Anne Frank interested us because she is one of the most well known people from this event, and was a teenager. When we went to the Chippewa Valley Museum for National History Day we were inspired when the historians talked about Anne Frank. Hearing more on Anne really helped us decide on our topic.
